D-SNAP Deductions

Non-reimbursable disaster related expenses (i.e. medical cost related to disaster, evacuation costs, storage fees, etc.).

SNAP Deductions (not all inclusive)

- ◇ Standard Deduction (varies by household size)
- ◇ Shelter (i.e. mortgage, rent, etc.) and utilities (i.e. electric, phone, etc.)
